



Jackson County Parks + Rec CAMPGROUND RULES



To ensure the safety, comfort, and enjoyment of all our campers, and to maintain the beauty of our parks and campgrounds, we ask that you observe the following rules during your stay. (Your camping permit may be revoked without refund for violation of the campground rules). **REVISED 12/11/18**

1. Attendant is on duty between the hours of 9am and 9pm. Standard check-in is 3pm. Early check-in allowed, subject to site availability. Camper must be checked in prior to 9pm.
2. A camping permit is required. Your permit must be posted on your campsite post where it can readily be inspected.
3. Each campsite must be individually registered with the name of the responsible person staying at each campsite, even those associated with group reservations. Bounce houses and/or outside vendors are not allowed. No large parties are allowed at campgrounds; these groups should make shelter reservations.
4. Once on site if you wish to extend your reservation, payment must be made by 12:00 pm of original check-out date. No campsite may be left unattended unless paid in advance. No campsite may be left unattended for more than 24 hours. For those campsites left unattended, the Parks Department is not responsible for theft or damage to personal items.
5. Camping fees are charged per camping site. A maximum of two units is allowed per site providing the total number of persons does not exceed 5 per site. There may be a trailer and a tent, or 2 tents on a site. Each site must have and utilize a camping unit as defined as: Fifth Wheel, Bus, Motor Home, Travel Trailer, Camper Van, Pick-up camper, pop-up, or tent.
6. A maximum of two vehicles is allowed per site. Additional vehicles will be charged \$5.00 each.
7. Tent Camping is limited to a total of five (5) days in any fourteen (14) day period at all County Campgrounds. Camping with Fifth Wheel, Bus, Motor Home, Travel Trailer, Camper Van, Pick-up camper, or pop-up is limited to a total of fourteen (14) days in any thirty (30) day period at all County Campgrounds.
8. Minimum Stay Requirements: The Minimum stay for a Holiday is two (2) nights. Recognized Holidays are: Memorial Day, July 4th, & Labor Day.
9. Check-out time is 3:00pm. Late check-outs are subject to a one night fee.
10. Camping permits will only be issued if there is at least (1) adult over 21 years of age. At NO TIME can adults leave persons under the age of 17 at the campground unattended.
11. Quiet hours must be observed from 10:00pm to 6:00am. Friends and relatives who are visiting our campground guests must leave the campground by 10:00pm. Do not distribute entry gate access code. All patrons, friends, and visitors must check in with Attendants to obtain and must properly display mirror dangler.
12. No vehicles of any kind may be parked on the grass.

13. Dogs must be under control on a leash not to exceed 6 feet in length AT ALL TIMES. No aggressive or barking dogs will be allowed and dogs cannot be left unattended. Campers are required to remove waste from dogs at the campsite and dispose of the waste in bags placed in the trash cans. Maximum number of pets allowed is three.

14. Fires are permitted only in stoves or fire grills. Fires cannot be left unattended and must be properly extinguished after use.

15. No objects may be tied to or hung from any tree or post.

16. Campsites must be kept clean at all times with trash deposited in refuse containers with a no littering rule strictly enforced. Garbage must be wrapped in paper or plastic trash bags before depositing in refuse containers.

17. GRAY water may not be discharged on the ground. Containers must be kept under drains and emptied at areas designated by the campground attendant or park ranger.

18. No dishwashing is allowed in drinking fountains, restrooms, or laundry facilities. Vehicle washing requires the purchase of an additional \$10.00 wash permit that can be purchased through the campground attendant.

19. No fireworks or amplified music is allowed.

20. No feeding of the geese or other wildlife is permitted.

21. Parents are responsible for the behavior and actions of their children at all times. Children must be accompanied to the restrooms by an adult.

22. No pools or water games are allowed at the campground. No person shall swim or wade in the pond at Longview Campground. Please visit our public beaches at Longview or Blue Springs Lake.

23. No extension cords shall be run from the restroom or campsites to other campsites. Campers shall not stay hooked up to the community water faucets for longer than 15 minutes to fill tanks.

24. Rough, rowdy, or disorderly conduct at any time shall be a cause for immediate expulsion from the campground.

25. No person under the age of 21 years shall possess or consume any alcoholic beverage in the park. No kegs are allowed in the campground. Any person in a state of intoxication may be evicted from the campground and removed from park property.

26. No person shall disturb in any way the natural terrain, plants, or animals in the park.

27. No person shall damage or deface county property.

28. No person shall operate an all-terrain vehicle; including scooters, golf carts, etc. in the campground. Radio Controlled vehicles of any kind are not permitted.

29. Panhandling and soliciting are prohibited in the Park per Jackson County Park Regulation 5010.1

30. No outside firewood allowed. All firewood must be purchased through the Campground Attendants. No exceptions.

31. No refunds for inclement weather. For cancellations a one night fee will be charged. All site transfers are subject to a \$10 fee. There are no refunds for early departures.
